**Financial Highlights**

**Revenues:**

- The NYS per student allocation budget line for was projected at 675 full time equivalents for at the allocated funding of \$13,877. The current enrollment is 723 students. Please note that this is a potential increase of approximately \$666,000 in per pupil revenue if enrollment does not decrease during the year. The attached financial statements reflect the budgeted enrollment of 675. We will keep a close watch on the per pupil revenue in the next few months to more accurately reflect actual enrollment.
- Title grant revenue reflected in the attached financials has not yet been confirmed, it is possible that these allocations may change.

**Expenses:**

- Overall expenditures are running on target with slight shifts between categories.

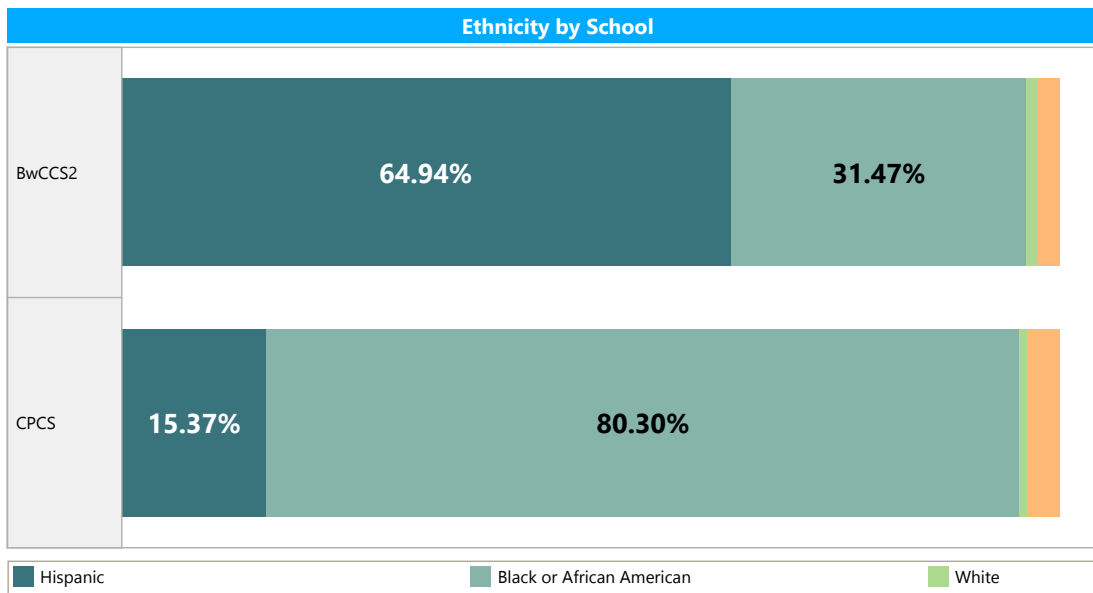
